

Planning for Standardized Testing During COVID-19

With all the changes and cancellations, it is a stressful time to plan for your standardized exams.

Please use the links below to for some useful information. Please remember that most testing agencies require up to two months to review your materials and neuropsychological evaluation. This means that you need to have your neuropsychological examination *about three months* before your exam date. **Call us today to schedule your evaluation so that you have time before the new examination dates.**

Standardized testing has been disrupted during the COVID-19 national emergency in the United States. Some testing agencies are going to online test administration beginning as early as April 2020. Others have rescheduled testing dates. **Below are some useful links:**
